ATTENDANCE - EC 48260-48264

Attendance

Good attendance is important to success in school. Children between the ages of 6-18 are required by law to attend school full-time. Your child misses out when missing school and the district is committed to working with families to ensure attendance.

Avoiding Absences, Written Excuses

The Redlands Unified School District urges parents to make sure their children attend school regularly and to schedule medical and other appointments after school or during holidays. The District also asks that travel or other absences be avoided during the time school is in session. The higher the District's daily attendance rate, the more student will learn and the greater the amount of funding that the District will receive from the state for classroom instruction and academic programs. The school calendar is designed to minimize problems for families who plan vacations around traditional holiday periods, and thereby minimize student absences. Following an absence, a student is required to bring a written excuse from home when returning to school. Illnesses, and doctor/dental appointments are considered excused absences. Absences without a written excuse are recorded as unexcused.

Excused Absences - EC 46014 and 48205

Pupils, with the written consent of their parents or guardians, may be excused from school in order to participate in religious exercises or to receive moral or religious instruction. No pupil shall have his or her grade reduced or lose academic credit for any excused absence or absences, if missed assignments and tests that can reasonably be provided are satisfactorily completed within a reasonable period of time.

- (a) Notwithstanding section 48200, a pupil shall be excused from school when the absence is:
- 1. Due to his or her illness.
- 2. Due to quarantine under the direction of a county or city health officer.
- 3. For the purpose of having medical, dental, optometric, or chiropractic services rendered.
- 4. For the purpose of attending the funeral services of a member of his or her immediate family, so long as the absence is not more than one day if the service is conducted in California and not more than three days if the service is conducted outside California.
- 5. For the purpose of jury duty in the manner provided for by law.
- 6. Due to illness or medical appointment during school hours of a child of whom the pupil is the custodial parent.
- 7. For justifiable personal reasons, including, but not limited to, an appearance in court, attendance at a funeral service, observance of a holiday or ceremony of his or her religion, attendance at religious retreats, attendance at an employment conference, or attendance at an educational conference on the legislative or judicial process offered by a non-profit organization when the pupil's absence is requested in writing by the parent or guardian and approved by the principal or a designated representative pursuant to uniform standards established by the governing board.

 8. For the purpose of serving as a member of a precinct board for an election pursuant to Section 12302 of the
- 8. For the purpose of serving as a member of a precinct board for an election pursuant to Section 12302 of the Elections Code.
- 9. For the purpose of spending time with a member of the pupil's immediate family, who is an active member of the uniformed services, as defined in EC 49701, and has been called to duty for, is on leave from, or has immediately returned from, deployment to a combat zone or combat support position. Absences granted pursuant to this paragraph shall be granted for a period of time to be determined at the discretion of the superintendent of the school district.
- 10. For the purpose of attending the pupil's naturalization ceremony to become a United States citizen.
- (b) A pupil absent from school under this section shall be allowed to complete all assignments and tests missed during the absence that can be reasonably provided and, upon satisfactory completion within a reasonable period of time, shall be given full credit therefore. The teacher of any class from which a pupil is absent shall determine the tests and assignments shall be reasonably equivalent to, but not necessarily identical to, the tests and assignments that the pupil missed during the absence.
- (c) For purposes of this section, attendance at religious retreats shall not exceed four hours per semester.
- (d) Absences pursuant to this section are deemed to be absences in computing average daily attendance and shall not generate state apportionment payments.
- (e) "Immediate family," as used in this section, means the parent or guardian, brother or sister, grandparent, or any other relative living in the household of the pupil.

Truancy Definitions - EC 48260, 48262 and 48263.6

A student is considered truant after three absences or three tardies of more than 30 minutes each time and the absences or tardies are unexcused. After a student has been reported as a truant three or more times in a school year, the student is considered a habitual truant. A student who is absent from school without a valid excuse for 10% or more of the school days in one school year, from the date of enrollment

to the current date, is considered a chronic truant. Unexcused absences are all absences that do not fall within EC 48205. The text of EC 48205 is provided on page 4 of this document.

Chronic Absenteeism - EC 60901

A student is considered a chronic absentee when he/she is absent on 10% or more of the school days in one school year, from the date of_enrollment to the current date. Chronic absenteeism includes all absences – excused and unexcused – and is an important measure because_excessive absences negatively impact academic achievement and student engagement.

Daily Attendance / CalWorks

Under the Welfare and Institutions Code, children of families participating in CalWorks must attend school regularly. Parents must provide attendance reports of their child/children upon request of the county. If it is determined that children who are supposed to be in school are not attending, the grant provided to the family may be reduced.

842Absence for Religious Purposes - EC 46014

Education Code 46014 and Board Policy 5113 states that pupils who are members of religions which observe religious holidays that fall on school days may absent themselves from school by making prior arrangements with the school. Pupils so absent must accept responsibility for making up work missed.

Arrest of Truants/School Attendance Review Boards - EC 48263 and 48264

The school attendance supervisor, administrator or designee, a peace officer, or probation officer may arrest or assume temporary custody during school hours, of any minor who is found away from his/her home and who is absent from school without valid excuse within the county, city or school district. A student who is truant may be referred to a School Attendance and Review Board (SARB).

REV Policy

ATTENDANCE AND NON-CLASSROOM PARTICIPATION POLICIES OF REDLANDS EAST VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL

A student will be marked absent by each teacher at any time the student is not present in their scheduled class. The automated caller will notify parents of all students who are absent at least one period during the day.

When a student returns following an absence, the Attendance Office must be notified within 48 hours (not including non-school days) by means of a parent/guardian note or telephone call stating the reason for the absence. Students will need to arrange to make up for missed classroom assignments.

Failure to clear an absence with a legitimate reason within the 48 hours will result in a truancy being marked on the student's attendance record. Using forged notes or making unauthorized telephone calls to clear absences will be cause for disciplinary action.

REV is a Closed Campus

Once entering campus, all students are to remain on campus for the remainder of their educational day. Students are not allowed to leave campus for lunch or for any other reason without a pass from the attendance office. Any student who leaves campus without permission and returns is subject to search for contraband.



Redlands East Valley High School Tardy Policy

Redlands East Valley High School staff believes that success in school is dependent upon punctual, regular attendance and quality use of instructional time. It is also the goal of all members of the school community to represent the core values represented in REVWAY: showing respect, having ethics, being vocal, having Wildcat pride, being accountable and becoming "you". To this end, students must regularly attend class, be on time, and be ready to learn.

Tardiness is defined as:

- 1. A student who is <u>not</u> in his or her classroom or assigned instructional area when the bell rings.
- 2. Any student who is tardy by more than 30 minutes will be recorded as an unexcused absence for the period (Education Code 48260 (a)).

- Students can remove tardies by completing the following:
 - 1. Community service-one tardy removed per hour of service
 - 2. Saturday school-four tardies removed per Saturday school attended
 - 3. Parent shadows student-6 tardies removed for a full day of parent shadowing student

Placement on the NO-GO List

Students who receive **21 TOTAL tardies** will be placed on the "No-Go" list. Students will not participate in extracurricular activities until their name is removed from the "No-Go" list.

Participation in extracurricular activities including **dances, **sports**, **music etc**. is dependent on being a positive, productive and professional member of the REV Community.

^{**}Community Service-All signatures and hours will be verified before a student is removed from the NO-GO List.

The No-Go list is updated weekly. It is the responsibility of the student to complete all necessary paperwork for removal from the No-Go List.

REVHS Guidelines For Student Dress

The Board of Education has determined that a student may not remain at school dressed in a manner which (1) creates a safety hazard for said student or for other students at school, and/or (2) when the dress constitutes a serious and unnecessary distraction to the learning process or tends to disrupt campus order. When the site administrator/designee determines that a student's attire is in violation of this policy, the student will be required to modify his/her clothing and/or apparel in such a manner that it no longer violates this policy. If necessary, the student may be taken or sent home with parental permission to modify unacceptable dress and return to school. Refusal to take steps as described in this policy shall be cause for disciplinary action (defiance) against the student.

Parents have the primary responsibility to see that students are properly attired for school.

Student Dress Code:

- 1. Shoes must be worn at all times. A substantial sole is required and enclosed toes and heel footwear is highly encouraged. For safety reasons, no slippers or house shoes are allowed.
- 2. Clothing will always cover all undergarments. Undergarments may not be worn solely as clothing (e.g. bra tops, boxer briefs). A jacket or cover-up to conceal brief clothing that reveals undergarments is not acceptable. Extremely brief garments are not appropriate. No garments should be so revealing/brief as to show undegarments while seated or standing.
- 3. Clothing or accessories shall be free of writing, pictures or any other insignia or logo which are crude, violent, obscene or sexually suggestive or which advocate racial, ethnic or religious prejudice or slogans or pictures depicting or promoting drugs, alcohol, tobacco or controlled substances. Specifically, no clothing that might incite hatred or unrest between students is allowed.
- 4. Earrings, jewelry, or accessories, which present a safety hazard to the wearer or others, are not suitable for school wear. Spiked/sharp accessories of any kind will not be allowed.
- 5. Only prescription sunglasses (medical documentation required) may be worn in class. Other types of sunglasses may be worn on campus outside of class.
- 6. Identified gang attire or any gang paraphernalia is prohibited. For the safety of all REV students and staff, the administration has the right to bar any clothing style that indicates gang affiliation.

NOTE: The following steps are taken to uniformly interpret and enforce the provisions of the dress code among RUSD secondary schools

Referral steps/consequences following student/parent contact by phone or in person:1st Offense: Counsclor/Designec

- 1. Verbal warning.
- 2. Correct situation (change into a REV dress code t-shirt or call parent to bring appropriate garment or send home if necessary)
- 3. Counsel regarding consequences of future violations.

Repeated Offense (Defiance): Assistant Principal/Designee

<u>2nd Offense</u>: Correct situation (change into a REV dress code t-shirt, or call parent to bring appropriate garment or send home if necessary); assign lunch detention.

<u>3rd Offense</u>: Correct situation (change into a REV dress code t-shirt, or call parent to bring appropriate garment or send home if necessary); assign two lunch detentions

41h Offense: Correct situation (change into a REV dress code t-shirt, or call parent to bring appropriate garment or send home if necessary); assign three lunch detention or suspension if appropriate.

<u>5th Offense</u>: Correct situation (change into a REV dress code t-shirt or call parent to bring appropriate garment or send home if necessary):suspension.

(NOTE: Any item(s) taken from a student will be sent to his/her Assistant Principal's office.)

ACADEMIC HONESTY

The Governing Board believes that academic honesty and personal integrity are fundamental components of a student's education and character development. The Board expects that students will not cheat, lie, plagiarize or commit other acts of academic dishonesty. (BP 5131.9)

Students are expected to demonstrate honesty and integrity while in attendance at Redlands schools. All students are expected to do their own work. This includes but is not limited to test-taking, class assignments, homework, essays, compositions, term papers, and research. All work submitted by students is to be a true reflection of their own effort and ability. If submitted work is found to be otherwise, the student has shown unacceptable academic behavior warranting consequences. Engagement in any of the following is considered cheating:

1. Claiming credit for work not the product of one's own honest effort

2. Providing access to materials or information so that credit may be dishonestly claimed by others

3. Knowing and/or tolerating either or both of the above

Any of these identified behaviors represents a violation of mutual trust and respect essential to the education in the Redlands Unified School District. Students who demonstrate these behaviors should expect the following consequences:

- l. 'Zero' on the assignment
- 2. Parent/Guardian Notification
- 3. Disciplinary Action

PLAGIARISM

See also the Academic Honesty Section above.

Any assignment submitted must be the student's own work in his or her own words. Students may not copy or rephrase materials from any other source, such as Cliff's Notes, Internet source, any other printed material or another student's paper. When sources such as these are part of an assigned research paper, the source MUST be properly cited. Student work containing plagiarism or copying of any kind will receive consequences as outlined in the Academic Honesty section.

Tobacco

Redlands Unified District prohibits the use of tobacco and tobacco products anywhere, anytime, on any District property, at school related activities, and in District vehicles. This includes the possession, sale, furnishing, and/or use of electronic cigarettes, or related substances (included but not limited to liquids and oils) used in electronic cigarettes, or smokeless non-tobacco ciga-rettes; also known as an e-cigarette, personal vaporizer or PV, e-hookah, or any form of electronic inhaler that vaporizes a liquid/ oil solution into an aerosol mist and/or vapor, whether it contains nicotine or not is not allowed.

Skateboard Policy

Skateboards, scooters and razors are not to be carried or ridden on REV's campus. These may be stored in the bike rack. A personal locking device is recommended.

REVHS Electronics Policy

BP 5131: Prohibited student conduct includes use of a cellular/digital telephone, pager, or other mobile communications device during instructional time.

Such devices shall be turned off in class, except when being used for a valid instructional or other school-related purpose as determined by the teacher or other district employee, and at any other time directed by a district employee. Any device with camera, video, or voice recording function shall not be used in any manner which infringes on the privacy rights of any other person.

No student shall be prohibited from possessing or using an electronic signaling device that is determined by a licensed physician or surgeon to be essential for the student's health and the use of which is limited to purposes related to the student's health. (Education Code 48901.5)

Disciplinary Steps

1st offense: Classroom Teacher

- Warning by Teacher
- Student counselled by Teacher
- Parent may be contacted
- Classroom consequence may be assigned

2nd offense: Classroom Teacher

- Parent will be contacted by Teacher
- Phone may be confiscated and sent to the office to be picked up at the end of the day
- Classroom consequence may be assigned

3rd and additional offenses: Assistant Principal

- Student is assigned lunch detention
- Parent called and parent must pick up confiscated item.

**Loss of any of these items is the responsibility of the student and his/her purent/guardian.

Classroom Interruption Policy

In order to maintain the best learning environment, REV will adhere to the following Classroom Interruption Policy:

Classrooms will be interrupted only for the following emergencies with the approval of an Administrator:

- Death or serious injury of a family member
- Household disaster (fire, flood, car accident with injuries)
- Anything directly affecting the safety of a student

Messages concerning a change in transportation when received from a parent/guardian will be forwarded to the student's next class.

Previously unscheduled appointments which require early dismissal of the student will be handled through the Attendance Office.

Items delivered to the school at the request of the student who has called home will be held at the switchboard. The student will be responsible for checking for the delivered items during passing periods or with an approved pass from a teacher.

"Forgotten" items, (i.e. textbooks, homework assignments, etc), which are delivered, will be held in the main office. Any items left for a student will be solely the responsibility of the parent and student, the REV switchboard attendant will not be responsible for ANY items left, lost or sto-len and will not be responsible for watching/attending such items – no exceptions

Special Deliveries

Balloons, flowers, and/or food deliveries to students during the school day are strongly discouraged. They will not be sent to the student during their class periods and students will not be notified during passing periods or lunch. Classrooms will not be disrupted for notification of delivery. Students may only pick them up in the front office after their last class of the day, Parent/student are responsible for these items: the REV switchboard attendant will not be responsible for ANY items left, lost, or stolen and will not be responsible for watching/attending such items – no exceptions. NO FOOD DELIVERY SERVICES ACCEPTED.

GENERAL POLICY STATEMENT:

Students shall respect all constituted authorities. Agents of this constituted authority are all teachers, counselors, principals, or other certificated or classified personnel who are given authority over pupils. This shall include conformity to school rules and regulations, and those provisions of the law which apply to the conduct of juveniles or minors provisions of the law which apply to the conduct of juveniles or minors. No student shall deprive any other student or group of students the apportunity to gain an education. Thus, any action, behavior, or practice which interferes with this right will not be tolerated. If, in the judgment of a principal, teacher, or counselor, a student is causing others to lose their right to an education within the total educational setting, he/she may be suspended. Habitual violations of board policy regulation student conduct shall be grounds for exclusion or expulsion.

Non-students who cause similar disruptions shall be given over to the police authorities. High personal standards of courtesy, decency, morality, clean language, honesty and wholesome relationships with others shall be maintained. Respect for real and personal property will be shown by all. Every student who gives evidence of a sincere desire to remain in school, to be diligent in studies, and to profit from the educational experiences provided will be given every opportunity to do so and will be assisted in every way possible to achieve scholastic success to the limit of individual ability. Recognizing the privilege of representing one's school, the Board of Education feels that students who commit the following offenses should lose their privilege to represent their respective school or district for a period of no less than one quarter and not more than one year. This is to be determined by the principal and administrative staff. Providing, possessing, or using dangerous drugs, alcohol, narcotics, or other injurious substances. Habitual truancy, Extortion of money, food, etc. from other students, Theft, Forging passes, attendance slips, or changing the marks on a report card.

Misbehavior in the educational setting which the principal and his administrative staff may feel brings discredit on the school and district. All school personnel have the responsibility to bring knowledge of any infraction of the above to the proper authorities. No student, regardless of his social status, race, creed, or color, shall receive preferential treatment in any matter outlined in this policy of discipline. At intervals, upon the request of the Board of Education, Superintendent, or the Redlands Teachers Association, meetings will be held to modify, revise, change or update any part of this general policy.

DISCIPLINE POLICY PHILOSOPHY STATEMENT:

It is the philosophy of the Redlands Unified School District that each and every student in the district is entitled to an equal opportunity to participate in the educational program. In order to provide this, it is essential that adequate control be maintained in the classroom and educational setting. No person or student has the right to interrupt, restrict, or prevent other students from being provided with an education which is rightfully theirs. Thus, every pupil shall have an opportunity to receive an education without fear of intimidation, threats, coercion, disruptions, etc. Any activity which abrogates this right, by whomsoever, shall be vigorously prevented by any and all legal means.

The Board of Education of the Redlands Unified School District in support of the aims of public education, believes that the behavior of students attending public schools shall reflect the good citizenship demanded of members in a democratic society. Self-discipline (responsibility for one's actions) is one of the important goals of education. The Board of Education believes also, that while education is qualified by, first, eligibility requirements and by, second, performance requirements, the courts speak of education as a limited right or privilege. Should the pupil fail to perform those duties required of him upon attendance in public schools, he may then be excluded from the school.


This position has been stated by the California courts as follows: "to the end that the public school system may in full measure function according to its purposes, there must, of course, be rules and regulations for the government thereof and these the legislature has either directly provided or has vested the school authorities with the right and power to prescribe the course of study to be followed in the various grades of the system, and to maintain at all times the discipline indispensably necessary to the successful prosecution of the high purposes thereof. To all such regulations if they be reasonable or not violative of their fundamental rights or of those of their parents or guardians, the pupils are bound to conform or suffer a denial of the right to attend the public schools" (Hardwich vs. Board of Trustees 54 C.A. 696) In conformity with the State Code of Education, court decisions, and others, the Board of Education establishes the following policy regarding student behavior and the management thereof:

Dance Expectations:

Redlands East Valley High School, in an effort to offer dances that are safe, drug and alcohol free, and comfortable for everyone in attendance, has developed the following rules that we hope parents, students, and guardians will understand and support. Students dancing inappropriately (see below) will be directed to leave the dance floor immediately, and then the students will be directed to leave the facility.

- Dancing styles that involve touching of the breasts, buttocks, or genitals, or that simulate sexual activity is NOT allowed. When dancing back to
 front, all dancers must remain upright- no sexual squatting or sexual bending is allowed, i.e. no hands on knees and no hands on the dance floor with
 your buttocks facing or touching your dance partner.
- Dress wear: Attire worn by the student should be appropriate for the function that they attend. Clothing that is clearly not appropriate, namely see through, extremely brief or that which leaves little to the imagination or is offensive will result in the student not being admitted. No attire which shows underclothing will be permitted. No refunds will be given under these circumstances.
- The dance rules form that you sign will be the only warning that will be given. No further warnings will be given at the dance. If a student chooses to behave inappropriately, the student will not be allowed to remain at the dance. All students MUST present a Redlands East Valley High School digital ID card in order to purchase dance tickets. All bags and outerwear will be searched upon entry to the dance. Students may NOT bring food or drinks into the dance, except with written medical authorization. Refreshments will be available for purchase.
- REV staff members may administer a breath analysis test to ticket holders upon entry in a pre-determined pattern. This testing will be done to discourage alcohol and drug use. In addition to the random use of breath analysis, staff may also administer the breath analysis on reasonable suspicion of use.

TREFUND POLICY: 1. If a student is escorted, or asked to vacate the premises at any time before, during, or after the dance by violating any of the dance rules, the student is NOT entitled to a refund. 2. If a student is unable to attend the dance due to an extenuating circumstance, that can be properly verified, then a refund will be given. ALL SALES ARE FINAL. Participants may not leave the dance and return. No Exceptions!






